Brief introduction

- Explain why this is an interesting or important question/s (research)? Keep it brief. Grab the reader's interest while introducing the topic. Explain the "big picture" relevance. Provide the necessary background information. What was the aim of the review?

Body of the abstract

- Describe important results from recent/previous primary literature articles. Explain how those results shape the current understanding of the topic.
- Mention the types of experiments done and their corresponding data (by you or other authors) - if applicable, but do not repeat the experimental procedure step by step.
- Point out and address any controversies in the field.
- Give your opinion for each issue (a must).

Conclusions

- Summarize your major points succinctly.
- Point out the significance of your opinion.
- Discuss the open questions that remain in the area and future directions.
- Keep it brief.
